## Holistic Scoring:

- Variety: A range of errors includes formation, punctuation, capitalization, grammar usage, and spelling
- Severity: Basic errors are more heavily weighted than higher-level errors.
- **Density:** The proportion of errors to the amount of writing done well. This includes the ratio of errors to the length of the piece.
