

WHAT IS A CAREER PATHWAY?

- Way to organize courses into paths that lead to careers/occupations.
- Pathways were developed in the 1990's from the School-to-Work initiative.
- There are six career pathways:
 - Arts and Communication
 - Business
 - Health Services
 - Industrial and Engineering Technology
 - Natural Resources
 - Public and Human Services

WHAT IS A CAREER PATHWAY PROGRAM OF STUDY?


- Programs of Study are embedded within each pathway.
- At a minimum a program of study is a **sequence of Career and Technical Education Courses** and a related academic course (similar to Level I Japanese and Level 2 Japanese).
- A Career and Technical Education Program of Study
 - Level 1—Pathway Core Course (ex. Business Core)
 - Level 2—Pathway Cluster Course (ex. Marketing)
 - Academic Course (ex. Economics)

FOUNDATION OF PROGRAM OF STUDY COURSES: STANDARDS AND BENCHMARKS

- All Standards and Benchmarks are developed with input from business and industry representatives.
- Standards/Benchmarks are written to ensure students have the knowledge and skills to be college and career ready.
- Emphasis is on content and processes, including problem-solving, critical thinking, and communication.
- Emphasis on Rigor and Relevance.
